March 1, 2022

Call to Order: President Dan Terrien called the meeting to order at 7:03 pm at The Village Grille in Allouez with 61 members and guests in attendance. He then mentioned the passing of member Diane VanBoxtel's mother in February.

Approval of February Minutes: President Dan called for a motion to approve the minutes as posted in the newsletter. Motion was made by Don VandenAvond and seconded by Ken Lyman.

Treasurer's Report: Diane Lyman reported the status of the club's assets. Membership is currently 156 paid members and 4 honorary members, with 28 memberships from 2021 not yet renewed. President Dan called for a motion to approve treasurer's report, motion was made by Mike Golla and seconded by Rick Northrop, motion approved.

Scrip Program: Diane reported that for the month of February we sold \$225.00 worth of Shell gas cards and \$90.00 worth of Kwik Trip car wash cards.
