First, I'll tell you how it all began for me.

I grew up with a grandfather who was a mechanic, he was a popular guy and a friend to everyone. When I was a kid, I vividly remember playing at my grandparents' house and in the garage, specifically in the 1937 Chevy that was parked in the garage. My grandfather bought it from his friend and mentor in 1969 for \$200. My cousins and I would don his fedora hats and pretend we were mobsters cruising around town looking for trouble. When it came time for an actual ride with grandpa, I was the first to run for the bucket to wash it before we would cruise. Growing up I was always the one out of all of my cousins most interested in the car and mechanics, my grandfather taught me a ton and gave me all of his tools when he retired. He had always promised that car would be mine someday. When he passed, my grandmother left it parked and under a sheet in the garage. When I turned 17, I asked her about it, and she said that she was saving it for me, but to be fair to the other cousins, I had to buy it, she couldn't just give it to me. Although come to find out, they all wanted me to have it too since it was likely I would keep and maintain it and that it would remain in the family.
