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Reflecting on 2022...

This being the final newsletter of 2022, let's take a moment to reflect on the momentum our club has gained over the past year.

Our newsletter expanded with our Community Connection column that featured eight different guest writers throughout the year and highlighted partnerships and other ways Corvettes of the Bay connects to and is part of NE Wisconsin and the greater automotive community.

In that same spirit, we forged a stronger relationship with, and found a new home at The Automobile Gallery for our displaced COTB Member of the Year plaque. Ideas evolved to the point that a custom stanchion was designed and manufactured for the plaque and put on permanent display at the gallery. The final stage of the plan is ongoing, with member Corvettes being rotated in and out of the gallery approximately every two months.

That wasn't all that the club accomplished on the community front in 2022.

- We partnered with the American Legion to give thanks to those who sacrificed everything for our freedom with Memorial Flag placement at the cemetery.

We made progress in growing the number of club runs. By my estimations, we increased the overall number of events/runs by almost 50% over 2021. There were many besides those already mentioned, but two that should be noted were a wonderful summer party at Primal Eats, and our first organized overnight run since 2019. We still have what I know will be an amazing Christmas party coming up on January 6th. (Remember, your check for \$15/person is your RSVP, due no later than December 30th!)

Behind the scenes many processes, policies and procedures were more clearly defined and executed. Our website was streamlined and cleaned up.

We also hit a record number, 247 members! With all those members, we were able to maintain such a large showing at monthly meetings that we had to secure the Village Grille's banquet facility in Bellevue starting in July '22. This arrangement should be able to continue through 2023.

How the Corvette started my auto-writing career

At this time of year, I always think back to the fall of 1978, when I moved from Staten Island, N.Y. to Iola, Wis. to work as an editor at *OLD CARS WEEKLY*. I had started writing small articles—mostly car show reports—a year or so earlier. At that time, I was working as a dairy department manager in a big supermarket. Old cars were just a hobby for me until I made that move and the 1978 Corvette Indy Pace Car made it happen.

The release of the '78 Corvette IPC was delayed several times. Corvette fans were talking about it. Many wanted to buy as many copies of the so-called limited-edition model as they could, since it was expected to become a "quick-classic" or instant collector car.

The list price of a '78 Vette was \$13,653. However, buying a Limited Edition replica of the Indy Pace Car could cost you lots more. It had distinctive black-over-silver paint and red accent striping. The package (RPO code Z78) included special new lightweight high-back seats, special front and rear spoilers, P255/60R15 white-letter tires on alloy wheels, lift-off glass roof panels and nearly all Vette options, plus IPC decals (unless you omitted them). The silver upholstery was leather or leather with smoke gray cloth inserts.

The limited-edition Pace Car replica was created to commemorate the selection of Corvette as Pace Car for the 62nd Indy 500 on May 28, 1978. Production of 2,500 was planned, but many people who saw a pre-production version at the February New York Auto Show wanted one. The goal grew to 6,500 units, roughly one for each Chevy dealer.

Pace Car buyers would also have to endure a selection of "forced RPOs" (items installed at the factory whether wanted or not). These included power windows, A/C, sport mirrors, a tilt-telescope steering wheel, a rear defogger, an AM/FM stereo with either an 8-track tape player or CB radio, plus power door locks and a heavy-duty battery.

Before long, the original \$13,653 list price meant little, as speculators eagerly paid double that amount and more. I distinctly remember stories about a Wisconsin supermarket chain owner who purchased seven of the cars once they came out.

They didn't come out on time, however, and that is the reason this particular Corvette model got my writing career going. In the spring of 1978, *OLD CARS* (it wasn't weekly yet) had sold a lot of advertising to an event called Auto Expo that was being held at the New York City Coliseum. A racing writer named Marv Brudno covered that beat for them and had the Auto Expo assignment, but he passed away very suddenly, just before the show opened. *OLD CARS* editor Terry Boyce asked me if I thought I could talk my way into the show and cover it for them. I told him I was willing to try to do that.

When I got to the show with a friend of mine who took photos for me (I didn't do that back then), the talking-in part went well. There was a black and silver Corvette with lettering on the door parked in an alcove at the Coliseum. Although I didn't know it, that car was the first regular production Indy Pace Car shown to the public. At the press preview, that car was not even on prominent display. My friend Mike took some quick black-and-white photos of it and then went on to shoot the older Classic cars at the show.

Well, as things turned out, I was able to sell that photo of the Indy Pace Car to 13 different publications. I did not make a whole lot of money doing so, but it lit a fire under my hopes of quitting the supermarket business and becoming an automotive writer. By September of 1978, *OLD CARS* had made a decision to switch to weekly publication. To do this, they needed additional staff and I was hired. I had no journalism degree and I had no job experience, but I had done a little work as the editor of two club newsletters and I had my photo of the first production-type Corvette Indy Pace Car. The rest is history!
