Call to order:

President Dan Terrien called the meeting to order at 7:00pm at The Village Grille in Bellevue, WI with 83 members in attendance.

Approval of February Minutes as posted:

President Dan called for a motion to approve the minutes as posted in the newsletter. Motion was made by Sally Northrop, motion carried.

Membership:

- New and potential members -

 - Darrel Burnett Executive Director of The Automobile Gallery, reports he can "Steal one of many cars from the Gallery!"

Membership dues are due for 2023 and can be paid today with Terri. Anyone who has not paid dues for 2023 is not a member in good standing. Anyone who was a member last year and has not renewed may be receiving a reminder e-mail from Terri and will be dropped from the e-mail list on May 3rd, the day after our meeting.

Treasurer Report:

Terri Villiesse reported the status of the club's assets and last month's sales of the Shell gas cards and Kwik Trip car wash cards. Membership is currently at 175 paid members – (29 single, 73 dual), plus 4 honorary. President Dan called for a motion to approve the treasurer's report; motion was made by Rick Northrop. Motion carried.

Past Runs:

- Jason Dellise reported on a flash run at The Wine Cellar in De Pere called "Wine of the Sea" on February 9th. This was an enjoyable structured event with a table full of wines, tasting how a wine is before and after aging in the ocean.
- Luann Poll reported on the "Sweet Social Gathering" at The Automobile Gallery on February 19th, along with a tour of the Captain's Walk Winery. Twenty-two members were in attendance.

Survey:

Luann has created a survey to get to know members – what would you like to see in the club? How can you become involved? The survey will be distributed at the April meeting or can be completed via e-mail with return date in May. Anyone who completes the survey will be entered in a drawing for prizes. At the June meeting, Luann will share findings of the survey.

Upcoming Runs/Events:

- March 16th Dinner date correction. At 1951 West (by Rock Garden), cocktails at 5:00pm and dinner at 6:00pm; 30 people have signed up. Diane & Ken Lyman
- There is an opportunity for an April dinner run. Please contact Dan if interested.
- May 21st Dan and Vickie Linssen are hosting a dinner run to The Lost Key Tap in Wrightstown. This is an upscale restaurant that opened one year ago, is completely renovated, and the Chef was hired from New York. The restaurant is closed on Sundays, however, the owner states if 40 Corvette members are interested, he will open on . The Chef will provide appetizers, a rolling buffet, main dish, and dessert for \$30/person. Plan to meet at the Swan Club in De Pere at 4:00, follow down along the May 21st river to Wrightstown, this is approximately a 30-minute drive. Cocktails at 4:30pm, buffet at 5:30pm. Pay in advance, details will be forthcoming.
- May 2nd Teacher Appreciation St. Joseph School, Pilgrim Way Chuck Templer. This event will be rain or shine, and is a surprise event for the teachers. Meet in the Ashwaubenon Target southeast corner parking lot with a time to be determined. Lunch will be provided at The Village Grille in Allouez for teachers and drivers. There are enough drivers. Contact information will be sent out two weeks prior to event.
- ¹ Derby Dash Days. Sally Northrop and Deb VandenAvond talked about celebrating the Kentucky Derby with Cathy Proctor, owner of Village Grille. Cathy set this day May 6^t aside to celebrate. Women are encouraged to wear a big derby hat! An opportunity to bid on 47 horses. This event is in the making, more details to come.
- May 11th Private Corvette Club only Sunset Cruise at Road America Mark Nemetz. We have 50 cars signed up for this event. We need 4 things 2023 Corvettes of the Bay paid membership, sign-up sheet, payment, and digital waiver. The digital waiver can be found on the events page at Corvettesofthebay.org. Other areas of discussion include:
 - Bring a couple of bag/folding chairs in the event we are bumped from the Tufte Center.
 - Bring your own beverages, no alcohol allowed.
 - Liability waiver form on your cell phone.
 - Take a tour of the control tower and gift shop after the event.
 - Be certain to sign up prior to meeting at the Swan Club.
 - Have a route to track in case the group is split up.
- May 20th Corvettes and Coffee at The Automobile Gallery and Festa Italiano Event. The Automobile Gallery will put on coffee from 8:30am-10:30am. Members can return that afternoon from 2:00pm-6:00pm to see \$30 Million worth of Italian cars on display. One car in particular is from New York; a 1964 Ferrari Lusso worth \$2 million. The cost of this event is \$5 to members.
- May 24th Our Highway Cleanup project, which was a way the members served the community, was discontinued in 2022. Cathy Harrison worked with the American Legion to place flags at The Allouez Catholic Cemetery for Memorial Day. It is anticipated there will be 3,000 flags placed. Cathy will lead that service opportunity once again for the club in 2023. Meet at 8:00am at the Riverside Drive entrance of the cemetery, a list of graves will be provided – this takes until 11:30am. The rain date is May 25^t see Cathy if interested.

Dan will set up a tent and new member forms. There is a specified area for COTB to park. For the run, there are four different routes which all lead back to The Automobile Gallery. 1973 Chevrolet Corvette **A Love Story!**

Soon after Luann and John Poll walked down the aisle June 1st, 1974, they found themselves falling in love all over again...with this 1973 Corvette Stingray! Ironically, they found it at a Ford dealership in Arlington Heights, IL. There it sat in its splendid Mille Miglia Red dress and 16,000 miles just waiting to be united with its new owner. A \$6300 purchase old newlyweds just starting out on their journey in life together. Too young to be cautious, a precious few seconds were spent weighing the consequences before Luann and John took the plunge again just one month into their marriage!

Armed with \$1500 in wedding gift money and John's parents' 1973 Chevy Vega as a trade-in, the Polls were soon proud new owners of a Corvette Stingray that featured more changes than any Corvette since its introduction 20 years earlier. A seismic shift was clearly underway in the automotive industry in 1973 and "America's Sports Car" literally "took it on the nose."

The 1973 C3 Corvette fell victim to the infamous 5-mile per hour bumper law mandating that all cars be able to sustain a 5-mph impact on the front without damaging lights or other safety equipment. The new bumper system added 35 lbs. to the weight of the Corvette and featured an injection molded urethane bumper which was dubbed the "rubber bumper" while the rear bumper remained chrome. The '73 Corvette's "nose job" also added 2 inches to the length of the car. In fact, the 1973 Corvette Stingray was chalked full of changes including

- The introduction of Radial Tires
- Stiffer Suspension for Superior Handling
- Light Alloy Wheels
- Recessed Air Vents on Each Side of the Car
- 40% Reduction in Interior Noise
- Steel Beams in Each Door to Protect Against Side Impacts
- Rubber/Steel Body Mounts Eliminating Interior Vibration
- Stationary Rear Window Cutting Wind Noise
- Asphalt-based Insulation on Floor and Interior Panels
- Functional Air Duct Hood for Better Cooling & Performance

Despite all those changes one thing didn't change, the owner. 50 years later, Luann and John have no intention of parting with their beloved Stingray even after purchasing a 2020 Corvette. It now serves as a sunny day driver to

Corvettes of the Bay events and wears its 102,000 miles like a badge of honor. 50 years later, it has earned its right to bask in the spotlight at The Automobile Gallery & Event Center in our Corvettes of the Bay display. We like to think of it as a perfect marriage!
