Corvettes of the Bay Monthly Meeting Minutes April 4, 2023

Call to order: President Dan Terrien called the meeting to order at 7:02pm at The Village Grille in Bellevue, WI with 82 members in attendance.

Approval of March Minutes as posted:

esident Dan called for a motion to approve the minutes as posted in the newsletter. Motion was made by Dan Brunmeier, motion carried.

Membership:

New and potential members -

- Tom and Shelby Schappa Owners of a 2006 Silver Corvette. They noticed a yellow Corvette in the Wilder Park neighborhood which prompted their interest.

 Bob Persson Owner of a 1981 Cream and Copper colored Corvette. Bob was a member for many years back in the day when there were 50 members. He took a break and rode his Harley for quite some time and is returning to COTB.
- Bill Sloma Owner of a 2018 Black Rose Grand Sport Convertible Corvette.

Membership dues are due for 2023 and can be paid today with Terri. Anyone who has not paid dues for 2023 is not a member in good standing. Anyone who was a member last year and has not renewed will be dropped from the e-mail list on May 3rd, the day after our meeting.

Terri Villiesse reported the status of the club's assets and last month's sales of the Shell gas cards and Kwik Trip car wash cards. Membership is currently at 205 paid members (35 single, 85 dual), plus 4 honorary. President Dan called for a motion to approve the treasurer's report; motion was made by Dan Linssen. Motion carried.

Diane Lyman reported there were 35 members in attendance for dinner at 1951 West (by Rock Garden) on Thursday, March 16th.

Luann Poll was unable to attend the meeting due to snow/ice storms. Luann put a great amount of work into the survey, and we're hoping the results will serve the club for years to come. Printed copies were distributed at the meeting and are available through e-mail; couples can complete the same survey. Anyone who completes a survey will be eligible for prizes.

Upcoming Runs/Events:

- There is an opportunity for an April dinner run. Please see Secretary Mary Ann to check out the run binder for ideas.

 May 2nd Teacher Appreciation, St. Joseph School, Pilgrim Way. Dan Terrien for Chuck Templer. There are more than enough cars available for this event. There will be 18 teachers participating in this event, and the drivers will also be treated to lunch at The Village Grille, compliments of Bob LeMieux. Meet at the southeast corner of the Target parking lot in Ashwaubenon, where we will then drive to the school. This is a surprise for the teachers. Since the students will have a longer lunch, there has been an interest from Corvette members to help monitor them outside while the teachers are out. There were questions from the club about background checks, but for this event, it is not needed, per Cheryl Smet, COTB member. Additional details will be provided two weeks prior to the event.

 May 6th – Derby Dash Days. Sally Northrop reports this event will take place at The Village Grille starting at 5:30pm. There will be a Nacho Supreme Buffet, dessert, and cash
- bar. The derby begins at 6.40pm, members can bet on 20 horses, and this is the first of the three races. Everyone is encouraged to wear a hat! The cost is \$18/person, checks payable to COTB and can be given to Terri at the May 2nd meeting.
- Private Corvette Club only Sunset Cruise at Road America. Mark Nemetz reports there are 50 cars signed up for this event, and the cut-off date is May 2nd. We need 4 things – 2023 Corvettes of the Bay paid membership, sign-up sheet, payment, and digital waiver. The digital waiver can be found on the events page at Corvettesofthebay.org. 1973 Chevrolet Corvette

A Return to Glory from the Ground Up!

Owner: Ron Rozmarynoski



Secretariat reigned supreme in 1973 dominating horseracing and the headlines on his way to mythically sweeping the Triple Crown with commanding ease. While Secretariat was obliterating records and becoming the greatest racehorse of all-time, Chevrolet was strategically introducing one of the greatest "workhorses" of all-time...the L82 · 350 Cubic Inch engine. Right out of the wrapper, the L82's secret weapon was a racing block with a high-performance crankshaft pushing past 6,000 rpm with a top speed sneaking up on 140 miles per hour. The L82 was so precise and impressive that it remained a go-to engine option for Corvettes until its retirement in 1980.



Secretariat

This gorgeous Dark Blue Vette is 1 of 5,710 Corvettes produced with an L-82 powerplant out of the total Corvette production run of 30,464 in 1973. Originally a GM executive car, Corvettes of the Bay member Ron Rozmarynoski spied it on a dealer lot in Sterling, Michigan while on a business trip in mid-1973. Barely broken in with less than 5,000 miles, Ron cut a deal on the spot and has owned it ever since.

Years of enjoyment on the open road came to an abrupt halt when a career in the oil industry intervened and swept Ron away to various parts of the world. His







Corvette patiently remained mothballed for nearly 20 years until Ron's return which accompanied his commitment to return his Vette to its original glory with a ground up restoration in 2017. Restoration expert Roger Micheau was entrusted with the project which took three years and was completed in June of 2020. This Corvette's fresh new look is symbolic of the fresh new look the '73 Corvette received all those years ago on its 20th anniversary.

Two years shy of retirement, Zora Arkus-Duntov, the engineering genius behind the Corvette, put his imprint on the '73 in both safety and speed. Innovations like radial tires, steel beams in the doors for protection against side impacts, and a stiffer suspension set the course for the future. Changes were evident from tip to tail including the tip and the tail! 1973 is the only year Corvettes featured a chrome bumper on the rear and a plastic bumper in the front in response to the new 5-mile per hour bumper law in the U.S.

Just like Secretariat, Ron Rozmarynoski's 1973 Corvette is the product of excellent breeding!
