Treasurer's Report:

1986 Corvette Convertible





Before the ball could drop in Times Square on New Year's Eve, Chevrolet dropped the hammer on the entire sportscar sector in 1986. It was a magical year when Chevrolet broke free from the government's Darth Vader death grip on the American auto industry and crashed the party with a Corvette ready to blow the top off the sports car market.....or at least lower the top! After an unthinkable 11-year drought without a convertible in the lineup, the Corvette roared back to relevance with a droptop for the first time since 1975. Setting the pace in a landscape

littered with underpowered econoboxes of the era is one thing but setting the pace for the prestigious Indy 500 for just the second time in history was a new high.

As if the Corvette wasn't flying high enough already, General Chuck Yeager, one of the greatest combat pilots in American history and the first to break the sound barrier, was the perfect choice to pilot the 1986 Corvette Pace Car at the 70th running of the Indianapolis 500. To commemorate the occasion,

all 7,315 Corvette convertibles produced in 1986 were Pace Car replicas and shipped with the Pace Car graphics leaving the buyer to decide whether to put them on the car.

Maybe Corvettes of the Bay member Joe Rabideau wasn't setting the pace at the 500, but he was certainly winning the race back home in Green Bay, WI. As a member of the sales department at Woody Jepsen Chevrolet at the time, Joe did most of the ordering of new cars and had the inside track the moment news broke about the Corvette convertible. Joe immediately jumped into action ordering every option available including a 4-speed with overdrive. By the next morning, Joe turned an order for the dealership into a personal purchase and this gorgeous, fully optioned white Corvette Pace Car with red leather interior was all his....and still is 37 years later! What arrived in plastic wrap in April 1986 turned out to be the 1,306th Corvette produced out of total run of 35,109 that year.

Putting the emphasis back on performance in 1986 generated numbers that stand up in any era. This beauty also has plenty of brawn with its venerable 350 V-8 scampering 0 – 60 in 5.8 seconds, covering a ¼ mile in 14.4 seconds on its way to a 150-mph top speed. Along with a fast car, we understand Joe had to do some pretty fast talking back in the day too when he arrived home 37 years ago and showed his young wife Sue his new purchase. All these years later, we at The Automobile Gallery & Event Center are happy to report that Sue, Joe and their 1986 Corvette Convertible have a perfect marriage!
