New Corvettes/Modifications/Tech Tips

Harry Liebergen – Harry shared that GM is having issues with their 6.2 liter V8 engines that are commonly used in their pickup trucks. If you have one of these engines from 2020-2023 you should check with your dealer and have it tested for potential issues.

Jerry Schaefer discussed there is a shortage of super Corvette oil for the newer Corvettes; so if you need an oil change, be prepared to wait. Amazon may have the oil at a cheaper cost, but you'll have to do the work!

Aluminum Can Tab update – Gene Blohowiak - Gene stated that from July 2024 to June 2025, we collected 58.84 pounds of tabs!

2016 Chevrolet Corvette Z06

"Torch Red in Color and Red Hot in Performance!"

For the sports car connoisseur craving a thrill ride that will simultaneously melt your heart and melt the tires the 2016 Corvette Z06 is that car! The 40, 689 Corvettes manufactured in 2016 represented the highest Corvette production run since 1984, but the Bowling Green factory produced an exclusive 2,732 of the Z06 Convertibles ranking them among the rarest Corvettes ever produced.

Gene and Linda Blohowiak's Zo6 is Torch Red in color and red hot in performance! Perhaps sensing its future collectability, Chevrolet poured everything into the seventh generation C7 Corvette during its triumphant run from 2014 - 2019. What was destined to be the final front engine version of the Corvette is jacked to the max with a supercharged 650 horsepower LT4 6.2 Liter V8 with a spine snapping 650 lb. ft. of torque. This Zo6 was a showroom rocket right out of the wrapper. The performance numbers stand up against any supercar in the world delivering a 0-60 time of 3.8 seconds and a top speed of 197.6 mph!

As fast as their Zo6 is, Gene and Linda took the scenic route before making this love connection.... 43 years to be exact. This car collector couple had other sports cars along the way but always craved a Corvette. Two children and retirement came first before making this Zo6 convertible their first in 2021. Despite being 5 years old, the odometer told a very different story. Their acquisition represented a nearly brand new 1,832 miles traveled since new. Shortly after, the Blohowiaks joined the Corvettes of the Bay club and have now received the ultimate honor by having their Zo6 featured in the Corvettes of the Bay display at The Automobile Gallery & Event Center.

Corvette's engineering team in Bowling Green employed the latest technologies to feed 50% more cool air into the LT4 powerplant to achieve world-class performance. We think we have found something even cooler. Gene and Linda Blohowiak have now added a second Corvette Convertible to their collection.... a 2024 Z51 Torch Red Corvette Convertible. Gene and Linda's license plate says it all.... No matter where they go they're CRUZN!
