President's Report

- Let's keep the momentum going and fill the event calendar. Looking for more dinner runs! June and July look great! Still room for more especially in August and September.
- Share the collected suggestions for future runs from last meeting. – **Sally Steffen**
 - A run to the Wisconsin Maritime Museum in Sturgeon Bay, with lunch afterward. There are also several breweries and wineries in the area that members could visit following the museum tour.
 - A trip to the Gilmore Car Museum near Chippewa Falls. There is a brewery nearby that could be included in the day's activities.
 - A Brewers baseball game outing, which could be either a day trip or an overnight event.

GT1 Z06 X

Owner: Darrell Bringe

1 of 55 Ever Produced!

With a racing resume as thick as a San Francisco fog, Corvette's C6-R racing team dominated the international sports car racing scene from 2001 - 2008 with 70-plus checkered flag finishes galvanized by prestigious wins on the world's biggest stages including:

- 8 Consecutive ALMS (American Le Mans Series) GT1 Manufacturers' and Team Championships
- 5 Class Wins at the 24 Hours of Le Mans
- 7 Class wins at the 12 Hours of Sebring

Champagne showers on the podium and being showered with praise triggered the ultimate tribute. In 2009, Chevrolet released the limited-production Corvette GT1 Z06 X in honor of Corvette's C6-R racing program's world dominance. Only 55 GT1 Z06s were produced in '09 and a mere 17 of those wore black like this one purchased new by Corvettes of the Bay member Darrell Bringe. One of the rarest factory Corvettes in history soon became the rarest of the rare in the days and weeks that followed!

The finish line for most became the starting line for Mr. Bringe. After completing his purchase of this GT1 Z06 at Bergstrom Chevrolet in Oshkosh, WI in January 2009, Mr. Bringe immediately sent his new GT1 Z06 to the top tuning specialists at Cordes Performance in Tempe, AZ accompanied by these specific instructions, "Fill my GT1 Z06 with enough horsepower to make it faster than a ZR-1!" What came home was a bad-tempered brute dressed for the drag strip.



The 505-horsepower factory 427 V8 returned from Tempe as a sanctuary of speed with a bellowing 660 horsepower and a neck snapping 630 lb. ft. of torque. The lengthy list of speed parts that went into this GT1 Z06 all contribute to a 10.5 second ETA in the ¼-mile on its routine trips to the local drags. The only place this GT1 Z06 is a lightweight is in the weight department weighing in at a helping or two of mash potatoes over 3,000 lbs.

As the owner of a second Z06 of 2015 vintage capable of 212 mph, Darrell Bringe has both ends of the speed spectrum covered. By going the extra mile with a plethora of performance add-ons, Darrell Bringe now has more smiles per ¼-mile!
